- Explore the city with your roommate's help. Find the best *pão de queijo* (cheesy bread bites), go to their favorite *samba* club, and try Japanese food in Liberdade (the largest Japanese community outside of Japan).

TRAVELING SEMINAR

- The Traveling Seminar will take you to **Salvador da Bahia**—a former port of entry for enslaved people—to examine the African roots of Brazilian culture. Social Justice students may visit a local NGO providing educational services for marginalized groups. Business students may visit an *aceleradora* (business incubator) focused on Black women entrepreneurs. All students get to experience the culture, religion, and scenic coastline that make Bahia unique.
