

# STUDY RACE FROM AN AFRO-COLOMBIAN PERSPECTIVE. IMMERSE IN COLOMBIAN LIFE.

CET Colombia is based in Cali, a city with the second largest population of people of African descent in South America. You explore the sociopolitical, economic, and artistic conceptions of the African diaspora in Colombia through coursework, interaction with local roommates, and co-curricular activities that take learning beyond the classroom. CET also helps you see Colombia's many sides through a week-long Traveling Seminar to Palenque and Cartagena. In Cali, living with a local roommate means that as soon as you step off the plane, you're part of a network of Colombian students who are ready to show you around the city.

# **ACADEMICS**

You take one core course, a two-week Spanish intensive course, and build the rest of your curriculum with electives according to your Spanish level to meet the total 15 to 18 recommended credits.

# INTENSIVE SPANISH LANGUAGE (PRE-SEMESTER)

45 hours. 3 credits.

You start the semester with a two-week intensive Spanish course.

#### **RACE, IDENTITY, & ETHNICITY**

Taught in English and Spanish. 45 hours. 3 credits.

45 hours. 3 credits.


# **CET SCHOLARSHIPS**
