If you've been sexually harassed or assaulted, we want to make sure that you get the help you need.

You decide which way to get help is best for you.

There are lots of ways to get help. You can come to us. Or, if you prefer, you can connect with someone outside of CET who can help you.

If you choose to report an incident to us, we are required to tell your school.

Our main goal is to support you and help you get resources. We are required to tell your college/university if you disclose an incident to us. This information is treated very sensitively by CET and your home institution. Your home school will reach out to offer additional support and resources upon notification from CET.

If you choose not to disclose to CET, there are still resources you can access.

There are many people who can help you completely confidentially:

- Counselors or psychologists
- GeoBlue emergency telecounselors available 24/7
- Clergy, pastors, or other religious leaders
- Call centers and resources at your US campus that are available by phone
